

Academic Integrity

- Students are expected to submit their own, original work for assessment.
- Any form of academic dishonesty is considered serious misconduct.
- *These behaviours compromise the academic integrity of our school, your good reputation and Husky PRIDE.*
- Academic Dishonesty may include, but is not limited to:
 - *plagiarism (copying or reproducing any work that is not your own without giving specific credit to the author);*
 - *having someone else complete an assignment for you;*
 - *handing in someone else's work as your own (even with a few minor changes);*
 - *looking at someone else's test answers;*
 - *communicating to another student during an assessment;*
 - *accessing and/or sharing answers and/or questions to an assessment;*
 - *accessing any notes or an electronic device (e.g. cell phone) during a test;*
 - *paraphrasing from a book, magazine, website, or television program without giving credit to the author;*
 - *helping anyone else to misrepresent their work.*
- Because academic dishonesty does not demonstrate a student's knowledge or skill, students found to be in violation will be given the opportunity to demonstrate understanding of the specific curricular competency AND teachers must be given the opportunity to assess the curricular competency.
- For any further cheating, the student will be referred to the administration. Parents will be contacted and the student may be declared ineligible for any school awards and other serious consequences, even suspension may result.
