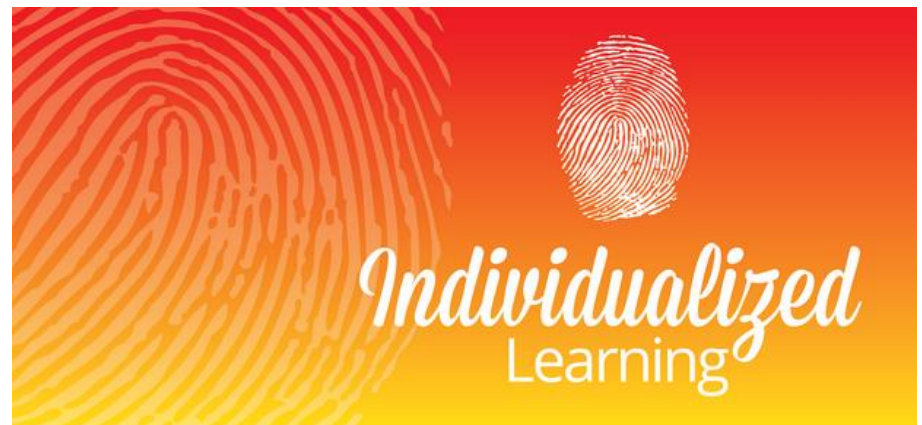


# What is ILT?

## *“Individualized Learning Time”*

- A 35-minute work period, four days a week
- *“Individualized”* because **YOU** have control over what school work you working on!



ILT is a period of instructional time built into the daily schedule that empowers students and increases engagement through them having greater choice in and control over their education. During Individualized Learning Time, students are expected to be:

- in a class, working on school work, either individually or in groups;
  - meeting with teachers for support on classwork; or
  - working on projects, under teacher supervision
-

# Expectations

- – ILT is instructional time, so you must use it as such and take it seriously.
- – Attendance is mandatory and will be tracked.
- – You must be in the designated learning space for that day (eg. Mondays, it's block A) **unless** you have an appointment with counselors, CYCWs or admin that you have communicated with your teacher about.
- – Phones are only to be used at teacher discretion and only for school work.

# FAQs



## **How will I be held accountable ?**

- Attendance will be recorded and available to parents.
- Reflection on learning and core competencies will take place throughout the year.
- Since this is instructional time, teachers will be ensuring you are using your time wisely.

## **Can ILT be used for meetings with clubs or sports teams?**

- No. ILT is considered instructional time and is intended to support you with your curricular needs.

# FAQs



## **Will I still have homework?**

It is unlikely that you will be able to do all your homework during ILT. You should not “save” work for this time.

## **Am I allowed to register and see any teacher?**

**NO.** Student must go to the teacher assigned to the block rotation for that specific day.

# So...where do I go for ILT?

The location of your Individualized Learning Time is prescribed, so you will always know where to be and you won't need to compete for space in a classroom. This will also allow everyone to have a more equitable way to meet with all of their teachers.

Monday – A Block class

Tuesday – B Block class


Wednesday – NO ILT

Thursday – C Block class

Friday – D Block class

Students on a Study block are to go to the library for ILT.

DHA Students in grade 8 go to the Library Hub on Thursday and Friday, and the grade 9 DHA students will initially go to the Cafeteria on these days.



# Where will students report in the case of an evacuation during Individualized Learning Time?

In the case of an evacuation, students will follow regular evacuation protocol and assemble with their FIRST BLOCK of that day teacher once outside.

# What's the plan...?

Sept 7th and 8<sup>th</sup>: Teachers review ILT information

Sept. 11<sup>th</sup>: Students begin ILT starting with A block class on Monday, Sept. 11<sup>th</sup>.

Sept. 12<sup>th</sup>: Since this is a Tuesday, students report to B block for ILT.

ILT will continue on Thursday and Friday and for the rest of the year.
